The word transition refers to the process of change.

When we speak of kindergarten transition we are referring to one of the most important changes a child will experience in their life. This is a time that can be very worrying for a young child. Leaving their home environment or the familiar environment of a preschool to enter a new environment.

"Superhero Day"


The SRC will be holding a **'Superhero Day' on Friday 7 June.** Students are encouraged to dress as a superhero they admire and bring a gold coin donation.
