CONFIDENCE – A CRUCIAL KEY TO LEARNING

Children develop confidence not because family and friends praise them, but because of their own achievements.

As a teacher, I have watched many children grow in confidence as they not only engaged in their own learning but took risks with their learning. Knowing that making a mistake is not only Ok but it is a pathway to how we learn best.

As parents, we naturally want to help our children to grow in confidence. Confident children believe in themselves and are able to face new challenges without feeling worried and anxious.

According to Liz Greene, former preschool teacher from Boise, Idaho, there are a few general guidelines you can follow to build your child's confidence.

Make time for play

Play is one of the best investments you can make in your child. The hours you spend playing with your children show them that they are valuable and worth your time.

Provide them with small jobs

Children need opportunities to contribute and feel they are part of the family/team. This means asking them to help with household chores such as:

- · Setting the table
- · Packing up toys
- · Dusting, sweeping, vacuuming
- · Doing the dishes
- Feeding the pets
- Washing the car
- Gardening

Depending on their age give them a job that lets them feel useful and successful.

Provide encouragement often

There's a big difference between encouragement and praise. One rewards the person while the other rewards the task. Praise can make a child feel that that they're only worthwhile if they do something perfectly. Encouragement, on the other hand, acknowledges the effort.

Children need to trust in their own abilities while, at the same time, knowing that they can cope with failure. It's by experiencing success and recovering from failure that they develop healthy self-confidence and learning mindset.



Weekly Tip supportive learning



When a child's learning is supported by their dads, they tend to be more motivated, engaged and enthusiastic in school.

Here are some tips to help you give your kids the support for learning they need:

Encourage your child to chat to you about how their day went - good or bad. This will not only help develop memory skills, it will also help build their ability to express emotions and extend their vocabulary beyond 'It was good/boring ok.'

Focus on attitude, not effort. No matter how their day went, try to reinforce the positives, give lots of encouragement and tell them how proud you are of their hard work.

Appreciate that there are different kinds of intelligence - academic intelligence is just one of them.
