Fathering Project Returns to Tamworth South

Last year many of our parents attended the pizza and paper planes evening as part of our Fathering Project. I have met with Paul Briscoe, the area coordinator of the project, to map out the events for this year.

Children who do not have a father figure can be accompanied by their mother or carer.

Dr Lisa Wood and Estee Lambin of The University of Western Australia undertook a review investigating how fathers and father figures can shape child health and wellbeing.

"We shouldn't underestimate the vast importance of fathers in children's lives, not only because children 'need and love their dads', but also because of the significant impact that fathers have on the social, cognitive, emotional and physical well-being of children from infancy to adolescence and with lasting influences into their adult life."

We know the roles of mums and dads in the home, the workplace and in society mean that the expectations on dads have changed and are constantly changing.



Data from The Fathering Facts survey of 1,800 Aussie dads shows that Aussie dads are doing more. Only 41% of Aussie dads surveyed indicated their parenting style reflected that of their parents. This shows that parenting styles are changing.

98% of the 1,800 dads surveyed recognise that fathering effects kids' health and wellbeing. An effective father or father-figure can have a profound impact on the health and wellbeing of the child.

64% of the dads surveyed found it challenging to find quality 'dad time'. The fact that dads are reporting a problem with finding quality time is an indication that their intentions and attitudes are progressive and well intentioned.

A key focus of The Fathering Project is to inspire and encourage dads and father-figures to be more engaged by making the time to connect with their children.

The Fathering Project's Dads' Groups are a perfect example of dads being creative through learning and play to connect with their kids.








Updated information about COVID-19 (formerly referred to Novel Coronavirus) for schools to consider using when communicating with parents & caregivers

Dear parent or caregiver,

The NSW Department of Education is working closely with the NSW Ministry of Health in response to the unfolding international COVID-19 (formerly referred to as Novel Coronavirus) situation.

Further travel restriction

Effective 1 March 2020 the Federal Government has issued a travel ban on foreigners coming to Australia from Iran. Only Australian citizens and permanent residents coming from Iran will be allowed entry to Australia, and from 1 March they are required to self-isolate for a period of 14 days after departing Iran consistent with the restrictions for those entering from China. Additionally, Australians have been advised NOT to travel to Iran.

Updated advice from the NSW Government for parents and affected staff regarding COVID -19 is:

Based on the new Federal Government advise any student or staff member who has left, or transited through mainland China since 1 February, Iran since 1 March or the Republic of Korea (South Korea) since 5 March, is excluded from child care services, school or work for 14 days from the date they left mainland China , Iran or the Republic of Korea (South Korea).

These students or staff members are also required to self-isolate from the community for a period of 14 days, as the COVID-19 incubation period can be as long as two weeks.

Employees who have visited or transited through mainland China, Iran and The Republic of Korea (South Korea) should also refrain from attending school for 14 days after their departure from China, Iran and The Republic of Korea (South Korea). Affected employees are asked to contact their line manager or principal via phone/email, to advise of their departure date from China, Iran and The Republic of Korea and indicate the numbers of days they will be absent from school based on their departure date.

Any confirmed case of COVID-19 will be excluded until they are medically cleared to return.

Close contacts of a confirmed case of COVID-19 will be excluded for 14 days since last contact with the confirmed case.

Students and staff who have returned to Australia from mainland China or Iran more than 14 days ago and have shown no symptoms are able to return to school.

The NSW Ministry of Health has processes to identify any close contacts of cases confirmed in Australia. Advice about not attending school would be provided to these close contacts by the NSW Ministry of Health.

Consistent with current guidelines, students who are unwell with respiratory illness should remain at home until symptoms resolve. In accordance with the NSW Department of Education's current practice, if any student becomes unwell, the school will implement infection control guidelines and follow the advice provided by the NSW Ministry of Health as appropriate.

Maintaining good hygiene standards is an important way to reduce the risk of acquiring and spreading respiratory infections.

Parents and caregivers are asked to promote good hygiene, including handwashing with soap as <u>handwashing</u> is the single most effective way to reduce the spread of germs that cause respiratory disease.

The NSW Ministry of Health has <u>advice and resources about COVID-19 in</u> <u>English</u> and <u>Chinese.</u>

The NSW Department of Education will continue monitoring the COVID-19 situation and provide parents and caregivers with updated information about the virus.

Parents/Carers

It is important that you notify the school if your child has a medical condition. This notification should occur either at the time of enrolment, or if your child is already enrolled, as soon after diagnosis as possible.

This ensures that our school community provides your child with the most effective support possible.

Please call the school if this applies to your child, so we can share information and clarify each other's expectations.


School Gates

Protecting Our Children

Schools must be following Department of Education Policies. It must be appreciated that your child's safety is paramount.

Every volunteer in the classroom, canteen, office and with sporting teams, must sign a Child Protection declaration form and provide 100-point identification (if you do not provide a WWCC number).

Parents/Carers transporting team members other than their own child will also be expected to provide a copy of their


license, comprehensive insurance and car registration. All

paperwork can be completed and presented at the front office. Please note that you only need to do this once in the year and it will be kept on file in the front office.

Parents/Carers of all early leavers must report to the front office to collect an Early Departure slip before collecting a child. The slip must be shown to the teacher to verify that the child has been signed out.

Parent/Carers must keep the slip with them when they leave the school, incase they are approached in the street by

HSLO's who often work with the police to complete a Street Sweep.


