Social Distancing and Graduation

You may be aware of some schools that have allowed parents/carers on site for graduation or presentation ceremonies. A parent has asked why, this has not occurred at Tamworth South.

This is a good question.

If we were a smaller school it might be possible however under the social distancing rules for parents/carers we need to allow 4 square metres for each visitor. As we have several classes in Year 6 and Kindergarten we are unable to meet this requirement.

Water Bottles

We have some very hot days ahead of us. Most children bring a water bottle to school and we are able to fill it up should they run out of water. Unfortunately, some parents/ carers are not providing a water bottle.

This is a basic requirement and I ask you to ensure you are meeting your parental responsibilities around this.

We will always provide water to a thirsty child but we would appreciate your support by providing a water bottle.

Remember bubblers are closed down due to COVID.

Bike Helmets

We have too many children riding bikes to school without a helmet. This is against the law and can cost parents a hefty fine, but worse still is if a child is hit by a vehicle or has an accident it may cost them their life or leave them with a debilitating injury.

Please ensure your child wears a helmet.

Sometimes students bring toys to school to share for news in kindergarten. Recently there has been an increase in the number of toys being brought to school.

To prevent students being upset if their toys are broken, lost or taken by others, we ask that students only bring items for news and they are kept in their bags.

Parents/Carers are reminded that school times are as follows:


Start time: 8:40am

Bike safety tips

Be seen – wear bright clothing, use flags, reflectors on spokes or reflective tape on bikes to ensure your child is visible to other road users.

Be in control – the right size bike is essential for your child's safety. Adjust the bike seat so the balls of your child's feet can reach the ground when seated. Make sure that the brakes, gears and bell are in easy reach when riding.

Be sure the bike is safe to ride – check the tyres, steering, brakes and for rust regularly. Show your child how to check their tyres for air and damage prior to each ride. Teach them how to pump up their your tyre.

Be alert when near cars – talk to your child about the dangers of reversing cars in driveways. Children often assume that they are safe from cars when riding on footpaths. Teach them to stop and check before riding across a driveway.

Be safe when crossing the road – teach your child to walk their bike across the road

Bikes and the law

- All bikes must have a bell or horn to alert nearby road users and at least one working brake
- Only children under 16 are allowed to ride on the footpath. An adult may ride on the footpath whilst supervising a child under 16 years old.
- Bikes are deemed by law to be a vehicle so all riders must follow all the road rules.
- It is illegal to ride your bike across pedestrian crossings unless the crossing has special bicycle lights.
- Ride across only when the bike crossing light is green.

Bike helmet basics

- Replace any helmet that has been involved in a crash as the foam inner liner can only be compressed
 once. After that it is not longer safe.
- Check inside the helmet for the Australian standards sticker to ensure maximum protection
- Helmets must be fitted correctly to protect against head injuries. Follow these 3 steps to correctly fit
 your childs helmet.
 - Take off your hat or cap as these stop the helmet from fitting correctly.



2. Adjust the helmet to allow no more than a two finger space above the eyebrows to the helmet.



Adjust the strap to form a V just below each ear. Ensure the strap is done up allowing only two fingers to fit between the strap and chin.



Please let your school know if your child has presented at or been admitted to hospital for mental health issues so they can discuss further support.


You or an advocate can talk to the Principal, Deputy Principal or School Counsellor/Psychologist to develop a plan.

Ask your school for help with:

- Keeping your child safe.
- Returning to school following a mental health crisis.
- Identifying school staff your child can talk to.
- Developing an individual support plan to help stay connected with school during tough times. This might include flexibility around school hours, homework or catching up with school work.
- Accessing support from the school and outside agencies.







Good for Kids good for life

RECIPE: BEEF AND BROCCOLI PASTA

Serves 4

Ingredients:

- 1 medium onion, finely chopped
- 1 tsbp olive oil
- 2 cloves garlic
- 400g lean beef mince
- 1 medium capsicum, chopped
- 1 tin no-added-salt chopped tomatoes
- 250g wholemeal penne
- 1 head broccoli, chopped in to florets
- 1/3 cup grated cheese



Method:

- Fry onion and garlic in oil for 2-3 minutes on medium-high heat. Add beef mince and cook, stirring until brown (about 5 minutes).
- Add in capsicum and tomatoes. Reduce heat to low and simmer for 10 minutes.
- Meanwhile, cook pasta in boiling water until al dente. Add broccoli for last 1-2 minutes of of cooking. Drain. Stir pasta and broccoli in to beef and tomato mixture.
- 4. Serve and top with cheese.

Variations: Add in herbs such as basil, oregano, rosemary for extra flavour. Before serving, place in baking tray, top with cheese and bake 15 minutes at 180 degrees Celcius.
