School Crossing Supervisors

Supervision makes sense

The School Crossing Supervisor program is a state-wide program that contributes to the safety of infants and primary school students. School crossing supervisors help students use the crossings on roads adjacent to or nearby schools. School crossing supervisors are provided where Transport for NSW guidelines and criteria are met.

School crossing supervisors are provided to increase mobility and safety around schools by enhancing the performance of pedestrian traffic facilities. School crossing supervisors provide additional measures for the safe and efficient movement of primary and infant school children.

The School Crossing Supervisor program is an important component of the <u>Safety around schools</u> program. Additional crossing supervisors

The NSW Government is investing \$18.5 million to provide an additional 300 school crossing supervisors at schools across NSW. More than half of the new locations have already been announced, with additional locations to be added over the remaining years of the program.

Our <u>NSW schools - Additional school crossing supervisors</u> lists the locations where school crossing supervisors have been appointed to date.

How to apply for a school crossing supervisor

Transport for NSW ill assess sites to determine their eligibility for a school crossing supervisor. School principals can make a request for a school crossing supervisor by using our online form.

Assessment of school crossing supervisor requests

The School Crossing Supervisor Program will assess the nominated site against set criteria. For a site to be eligible for a school crossing supervisor it must meet the following criteria:

- The site must have an existing children's crossing, pedestrian crossing (zebra) or combined crossing (children's and zebra)
- The crossing must be used by infant and/or primary school children
- The site must be located within a 40km/h school zone
- In the morning or afternoon, the crossing must register counts of either:

50 or more unaccompanied infant and/or primary school children, or

300 or more passenger car units (heavy vehicles over three tonnes unladen are counted as two passenger car units)

 The site must be considered a safe working environment for a school crossing supervisor.

Interested in becoming a school crossing supervisor?

School crossing supervisors play an important part in child road safety. The role would suit people who enjoy working with children and who wish to work part-time. The School Crossing Program regularly recruits school crossing supervisors throughout the state. School crossing supervisors need to be:

- Punctual and reliable
- Vigilant, calm and confident with working near traffic
- Able to provide clear instructions
- Able to communicate with adults and children.

Employment and training

- All school crossing supervisors are trained before undertaking duty on a crossing
- School crossing supervisors are re-trained on a regular basis
- Criminal Record checks and Working with Children checks are carried out before the appointment of school crossing supervisor and at regular intervals during the employment period
- School crossing supervisors only work on publicly notified school days, at crossings located within 40 km/h school zones.



It is important that you notify the school if your child has a medical condition. This needs to be supported by your Doctor.


Your Doctor will provide you with a Medical Action Plan, this action plan is only active for 12 months.




