If you are caught by Police parking in bus zone areas you will be issued a fine of hefty fine.

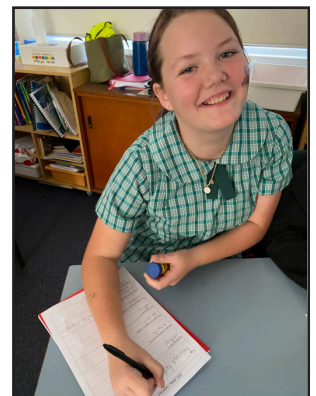
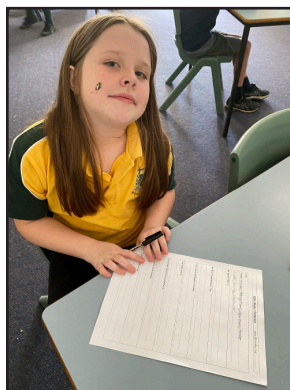
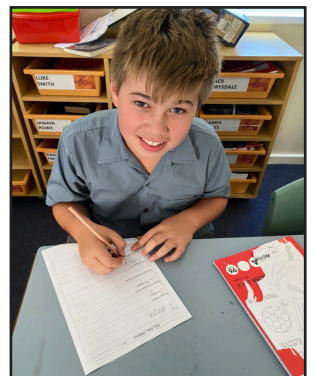
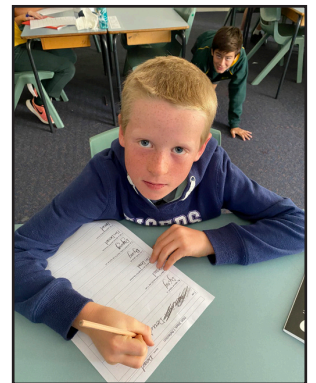
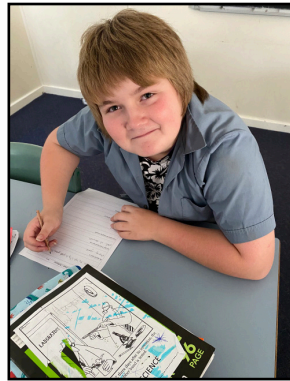

SCHOOL ZONE ROAD SAFETY

Understanding the road rules

No Parking
A driver must not stop for more than two minutes. You must remain in or within three metres of the vehicle.
Disobey No Parking sign \$187 fine & 2 demerit points

No Stopping
A driver must not stop in this area.
Disobey No Stopping sign \$337 fine & 2 demerit points

Bus Zone
Vehicles other than buses are prohibited from parking or stopping in this area. Hours of operation may apply. Restrictions apply for those times only.
Stop in Bus Zone \$337 fine & 2 demerit points

School Zone
40km/h speed limit during hours of operation. Double demerits apply for speed offences in a school zone.
Stop in Intersection in school zone \$448 & 2 demerit points

Crossings
A driver must stop at the white hold line if pedestrians are waiting to cross. Drivers must remain stationary until the crossing is clear of pedestrians and must obey instructions from School Crossing supervisors.
Stop On/Near Children's Crossing \$448 fine & 2 demerit points

What you can do

Here are a few things you can do to help keep your child and others safer during drop-off and pick-up times during the school week.

- ▶ Always park and turn legally around schools and avoid dangerous manoeuvres like U-turns and three-point turns
- ▶ Its safest for children to get out of the car on the kerb side of the road to be away from passing traffic.
- ▶ Where provided, use Children's Crossings to drop-off & pick-up children.
- ▶ Always hold your child's hand - young children may be easily distracted and wander into traffic.
- ▶ Always give way to pedestrians especially when entering and leaving driveways.
- ▶ Stick to the 40km/h speed limit in a school zone as children are about and can be unpredictable.
- ▶ Make sure your children are in the correct child car seat that is fitted and used correctly.
- ▶ Make sure your child is wearing a helmet when riding a bike, scooter or skating.
- ▶ Look out for buses – a 40km/h speed limit applies which school bus lights flash.

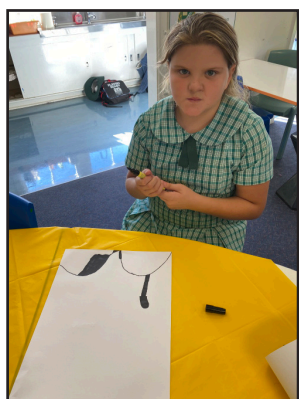
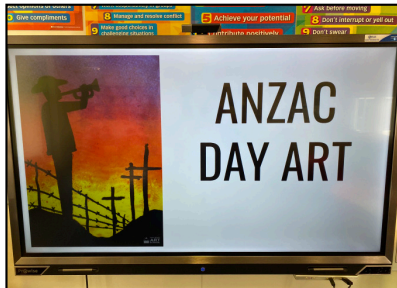
Always meet your child at the bus stop. Never meet them on the opposite side of the road and call them across.

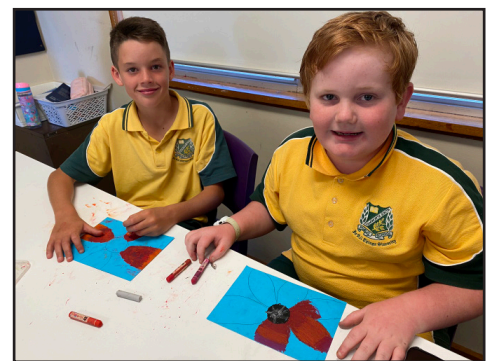
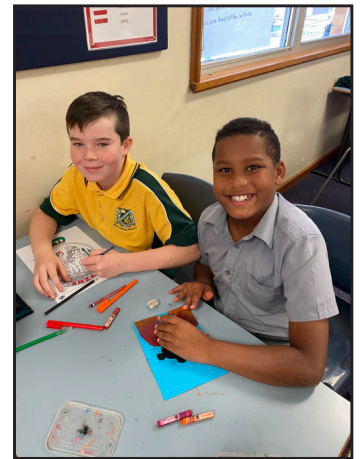

**Department of Education Policy
Protecting Our Children**

Schools must be following Department of Education Policies. It must be appreciated that your child's safety is paramount.

Every volunteer in the classroom, canteen, office and with sporting teams, must sign a Child Protection declaration form and provide 100-point identification (if you do not provide a WWCC number).

Parents/Carers transporting team members other than their own child will also be expected to provide a copy of their license, comprehensive insurance and car registration. All paperwork can be completed and presented at the front office. Please note that you only need to do this once in the year and it will be kept on file in the front office.

Parents/Carers of all early leavers must report to the front office to collect an Early Departure slip before a call will be made for your child to come to the office.

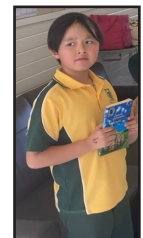

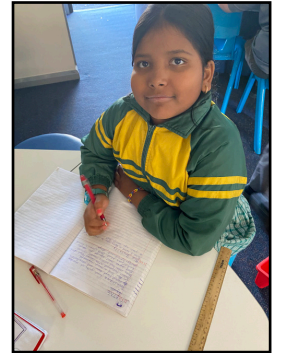
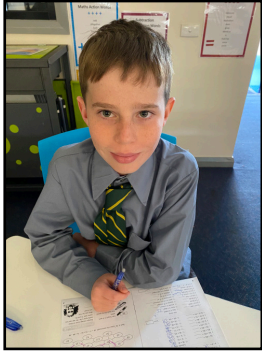
Home Reading Winners

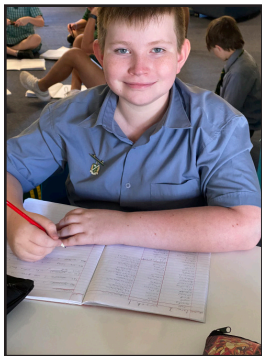




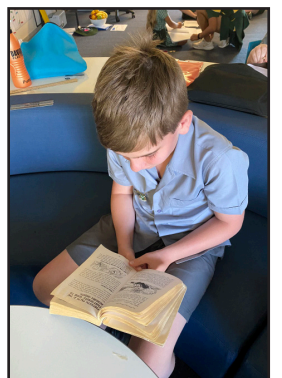

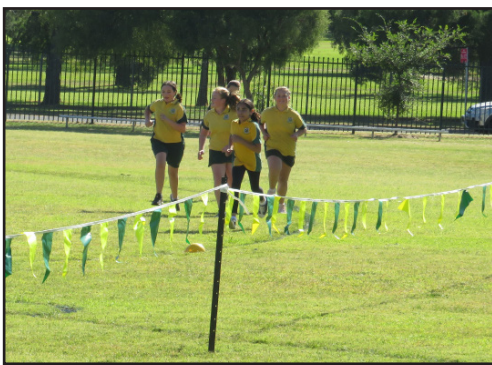

2021 NSW PREMIER'S READING CHALLENGE

Exciting news, the 2021 NSW Premier's Reading Challenge has started and our School is once again participating! All students are able to participate.

This is a great opportunity and a fun way to encourage children to read. The Challenge aims to encourage a love of reading for leisure and pleasure in students, and to enable them to experience quality literature.

Things you should know...

- The Premier's Reading Challenge officially began for 2021 on 1st March and concludes on 20th August.
- It is not a competition but a challenge to each student to read, to read more and to read more widely.
- Students select and read books from preselected lists of books on the PRC website. There are over 11,000 books on the lists to choose from!
- A minimum number of books must come from the lists but students can also read up to 5 Personal Choice books.
- Students either record their books in their personal Online Student Reading Record on the PRC website, or on a reading log (available at the school library or on the PRC website).
- A direct link to the Premier's Reading Challenge website can be found in the Student Portal under the Learning section.
- The PRC Student Site can also be accessed at <https://online.del.nsw.edu.au/prc/studentExperience.html#/>
- Students log in to the PRC website using their Department of Education (DoE) username and password. These are the same details the students use to access the computer network at school.
- All books need to be read and logged by 20th August 2021 so they can be validated by the school and submitted to the PRC.
- Some Kindergarten, Year 1 and Year 2 class will complete the challenge in class. Check with the class teacher if you are not sure.

Placement procedures for Year 5 entry to an opportunity class in 2022

'Intention to apply for Year 5 entry to an opportunity class in 2022'
 For metropolitan/regional applicants

Dear Parent/Carer,
 Opportunity classes cater for academically gifted and high potential students who may otherwise be without sufficient classmates at their own academic and social level. Successful students will usually have to leave their current school to enrol in a school with an opportunity class for Years 5 and 6.

Testing and assessment
 Applications for opportunity class placement are considered mainly on the combined results of the Opportunity Class Placement Test and school assessments. Students who wish to be considered for opportunity class placement will sit the Opportunity Class Placement Test on **Wednesday 21 July 2021**.

How to apply
 If you would like to have your child considered for Year 5 opportunity class entry in 2021, you need to apply between **Tuesday 20 April 2021** and **Friday 7 May 2021**. You will need to access the online application at: <https://education.nsw.gov.au/public-schools/selective-high-schools-and-opportunity-classes/year-5>. You must **not** use the child's email address.

If you do not have internet access, you could apply at a public library. If you have a disability that prevents you from using a computer, you can contact the Team for assistance after **Tuesday 20 April 2021**.

You must submit only **ONE** application for each student.

Important – the school cannot apply on your behalf.

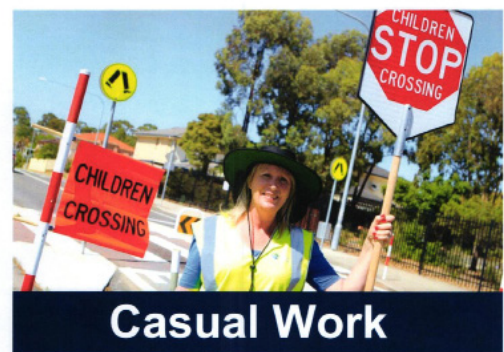
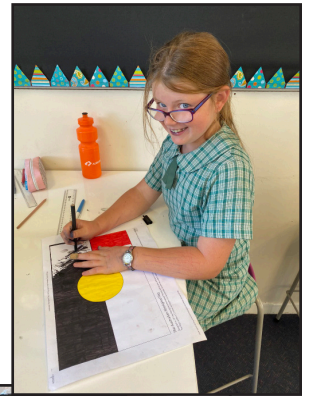
5N-01 completed their first week with a comprehension task, learning about floods which affected students, families and animals in the Coffs Harbour region.

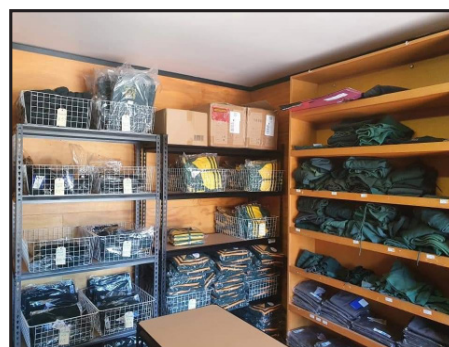
