






We commemorated the Australian and New Zealand Army Corps and honour the men and women who have served our nation in wars, conflicts and peacekeeping operations.

Policies. It must be appreciated that your child's safety is paramount.

Every volunteer in the classroom, canteen, office and with sporting teams, must sign a Child Protection declaration form and provide 100-point identification (if you do not provide a WWCC number).

Parents/Carers transporting team members other than their own child will also be expected to provide a copy of their license,

comprehensive insurance and carregistration. All paperwork can be completed and presented at the front office. Please note that you only need to do this once in the year and it will be kept on file in the front office.

Parents/Carers of all early leavers must report to the front office to collect an Early Departure slip before a call will be made for your child to come to the office.

Parent/Carers must keep the slip with them when they leave the school, in case they are approached in the street by HSLOs who often work with the police to complete a Street Sweep. Checking on school age children who are not at school.

#### Placement procedures for Year 5 entry to an opportunity class in 2022

'Intention to apply for Year 5 entry to an opportunity class in 2022' For metropolitan/regional applicants

#### ear Parent/Carer

Opportunity classes cater for academically gifted and high potential students who may otherwise be without sufficient classmates at their own academic and social level. Successful students will usually have to leave their current school to enrol in a school with an opportunity class for Years 5 and 6.

#### Testing and assessment

Applications for opportunity class placement are considered mainly on the combined results of the Opportunity Class Placement Test and school assessments. Students who wish to be considered for opportunity class placement will sit the Opportunity Class Placement Test on **Wednesday 21 July 2021**.

#### How to apply

If you would like to have your child considered for Year 5 opportunity class entry in 2021, you need to apply between Tuesday 20 April 2021 and Friday 7 May 2021. You will need to access the online application at https://education.nsw.gov.au/publics-chool/selective-high-schools-and-opportunity-classes/year-5. You must not use the child's email address.

If you do not have internet access, you could apply at a public library. If you have a disability that prevents you from using a computer, you can contact the Team for assistance after **Tuesday 20 April 2021**.

You must submit only ONE application for each student.

Important - the school cannot apply on your behalf.

This is a great opportunity and a fun way to encourage children to read. The Challenge aims to encourage a love of reading for leisure and pleasure in students, and to enable them to experience quality literature.									
Things you should know									
0	The Premier's Reading Challenge officially began for 2021 on 1st March and concludes on 20 <sup>th</sup> August.								
0	It is not a competition but a challenge to each student to read, to read more and to read more widely.								
0	Students select and read books from preselected lists of books on the PRC website. There are over 11,000 books on the lists to choose from!								
0	A minimum number of books must come from the lists but students can also read up to 5 Personal Choice books.								
0	Students either record their books in their personal Online Student Reading Record on the PRC website, or on a reading log (available at the school library or on the PRC website).								
0	A direct link to the Premier's Reading Challenge website can be found in the Student Portal under the Learning section.								
0	The PRC Student Site can also be accessed at https://online.det.nsw.edu.au/prc/studentExperience.html#/								
0	Students log in to the PRC website using their Department of Education (DoE) username and password. These are the same details the students use to access the computer network at school.								
0	All books need to be read and logged by 20th August 2021 so they can be validated by the school and submitted to the PRC.								
0	Some Kindergarten, Year 1 and Year 2 class will complete the challenge in class. Check with the class teacher if you are not sure.

4G-05 have been working hard in Mathematics!


They have applied their knowledge of place value to order, read and represent numbers of five-digits and beyond.
