National Assessment Program – Literacy and Numeracy (NAPLAN)

Schools play a central role in ensuring the smooth running of NAPLAN.

As children progress through their school years, it is very important that checks are made along the way to see how well they are learning the essential skills of reading, writing and mathematics.

NAPLAN is a point-in-time assessment that allows parents to see how their child is progressing in literacy and numeracy against the national standard and compared with their peers throughout Australia. At the classroom level, NAPLAN provides additional information to support teachers' professional judgement about student progress. Federal, state and territory education ministers agreed to gradually transition NAPLAN online by 2022. NAPLAN Online is a tailored test that adapts to student responses, providing better assessment and more precise results.

At Tamworth South we are completing NAPLAN online. The test is administered by the Instructional Leaders ensuring the delivery is consistent and within Department guidelines.

The 2021 NAPLAN Online test window runs from 11-21 May.





Mrs Batho, our K-2 Instructional Leader has been working closely with 2N-16 students on their ANZAC unit to improve their writing.


















