REPORTING TIME

Student reports are due to be distributed this week. Teachers have been busy examining student results to make point in time judgements about student performance.

If your child receives 'sound' then that means they are performing at a level appropriate at that point of time. It does not mean that if they receive another 'sound' in the December report that they have not progressed. It means they are where they should be at that point in time.

The scale lets teachers report student academic achievements at any point in time using clear standards.

Grades are one aspect of school reporting to parents. Other important tools include:

- parent-teacher interviews
- information about student effort and application.

Information regarding parent teacher interviews have been distributed. If you haven't received a booking sheet please phone the school.

The Common Grade Scale below describes performance at each of five grade levels.

- **Outstanding -** The student has an extensive knowledge and understanding of the content and can readily apply this knowledge. In addition, the student has achieved a very high level of competence in the processes and skills and can apply these skills to new situations.
- **High -** The student has a thorough knowledge and understanding of the content and a high level of competence in the processes and skills. In addition, the student is able to apply this knowledge and these skills to most situations.
- **Sound -** The student has a sound knowledge and understanding of the main areas of content and has achieved an adequate level of competence in the processes and skills.
- **Basic -** The student has a basic knowledge and understanding of the content and has achieved a limited level of competence in the processes and skills.
- Limited The student has an elementary knowledge and understanding in few areas of the content and has achieved very limited competence in some of the processes and skills

Congratulations TSPS Canteen


All school canteens run on strict health and safety guidelines.






If you have a child ready for kindergarten or you know someone who has a child ready to start school next year please contact the school and ask for an enrolment pack.

If you are out of zone you will need to complete an out of zone application. These applications are considered by a panel who will decide whether to accept or decline the enrolment based on the information provided.

When enrolling a student into a government school, you will need to have a number of documents.

Please provide a copy of a **standard birth certificate** (commemorative birth certificates cannot be used for enrolment), Australian Immunisation Register (AIR) statement/certificate and several documents proving residential address in the name of the enrolling parent or carer.





















Please remember to pack a serving of fruit or vegetables for your child to take to school every day.

Each class participates in a break during the morning session to allow students to 'refuel' on fruit and vegetables and 'rehydrate' with water.

Students who are not hungry and who are well hydrated perform better in the classroom, show increased concentration and are less likely to be distracted or disruptive.





Canteen News

Canteen can once again have visitors on site as per school regulations.

Orders after the 9:10am morning bell will only be able to be sandwiches.

We are now able to have volunteers back, however some days will still only have one staff member on site, so we appreciate your patience and understanding.

We encourage all to utilize the Flexi School App, it is very easy to use and convenient.

If you need to cancel a Flexi-School order, please do so before 9:00am, go into your order and press cancel, you will be refunded through Flexi themselves back into your account, we are not able to cancel the order ourselves as this is your individual account.

Please be aware that once an order is cooked, we are not able to refund if the child is not at school or leaves early, so we need to know as soon as possible, if your child has a sibling, we will offer it to them so it does not go to waste if they wish to have it.

We can hold some food over for the next day once the student is back at school and we will work with you as much as we can, however we cannot do this for anything hot as this would violate health and safety regulations.

We would like to thankyou all for your patience and understanding over the last couple of years with all the COVID issues, we appreciate your continued support of our canteen.

Uniform Shop Extra Hours

Uniform Shop will be open between 12:30pm and 1:30pm each day. *Extra hours are Tuesday and Thursday from 2:30pm to 3:15pm next to the Canteen. Eftpos and cash will be accepted.*

Parents/Carers can come to the canteen between the above times as we are unable to sell uniform shop stock in the mornings, due to no volunteers at this stage.

Parents/Carers can phone the school and be put through to order and the stock will be sent to the child in the lunch baskets.

Flexi Schools is still the most preferred option as it is easy for all. Any orders placed before 5:00pm should be sent to the student the next school day, however, sometimes there can be delays but all stock should be provided within 3 days of order.

If a student is away when order gets sent to their classroom, the class teacher will hold it for them for the next time they are in.



Uniform Shop through Flexischools

If you are placing an order through Flexischools you will need to place the order by 5:00pm the day before.

You will need to open your App

- Choose "shop"
- Click green order button
- Choose your delivery date
- Click through the categories to find what you need
- Confirm your order
- Choose your payment type

Your order with your invoice will be sent to your child's classroom to take home.

If you require an exchange of sizes please keep all tags on the items if you wish to exchange.
