Holiday Break

Next week is the last week of term 3. Thursday 22 September is now a public holiday declared by the Prime Minister to honour Queen Elizabeth II following her death last week. The school will not be open on this day.

In term 4 there is no school development day so school resumes for students and staff on Monday, 10 October. Given our experience of COVID-19 after holiday periods, it is expected that we may need to take greater care for the first three or four weeks of Term 4 with an increase in illness for the first two weeks. This will be due to families mixing with people outside the Armidale community and travels further afield. Please take care and stay safe. We look forward to welcoming our students and community back for term 4.

NAPLAN SUCCESS

The NAPLAN results were distributed to year 3 and 5 students last week.

We analyse the results along with several data sources to determine areas of need. This informs school planning and areas of focus in teaching programs. This is an ongoing process that is resisted throughout the year as we look at external and internal data to inform our decisions. As a school we have performed extremely well for the second year in a row. A broad outline of results are listed below:

These Tamworth South Public School students may have been the last children in Australia to sing this song, as the next morning when they woke up, they heard the news that Queen Elizabeth II had passed away, and we now had a King as our head of state.

The students also visited Taronga Western Plains Zoo and got a "backstage" glimpse of the zoo during feeding time. Following a delicious breakfast, they saw more animals in their exhibits and shopped at the souvenir store. It was a fantastic excursion!
