Administration Refurbishment and Gate Upgrade Complete

Security

Tears in the Jungle

The Year 4 Literacy studies for term 3 was informative texts focusing on the text Tears in the Jungle, Authors Daniel & William Clarke.

Students undertook a geographical investigation into the significance of the Borneo jungle for people, animals and the environment, and ways in which it is perceived and protected. Their scientific investigations into

classification of living things and the functioning of local environments deepened students' understandings of the interconnections and interdependencies in natural environments.

In addition to composing a variety of texts, students were also introduced to their personal perceptions and responses of orangutans and the Borneo jungle in visual art. 4H-04 were introduced to Google Classrooms to advance their technology and literacy skills whilst studying Tears in the Jungle.

Please be aware that once an order is cooked, we are not able to refund if the child is not at school or leaves early, so we need to know as soon as possible, if your child has a sibling, we will offer it to them so it does not go to waste if they wish to have it.

We can hold some food over for the next day once the student is back at school and we will work with you as much as we can, however we cannot do this for anything hot as this would violate health and safety regulations.

Parents/Carers can phone the school and be put through to order and the stock will be sent to the child in the lunch baskets.

Flexi Schools is still the most preferred option as it is easy for all. Any orders placed before 5:00pm should be sent to the student the next school day, however, sometimes there can be delays but all stock should be provided within 3 days of order.

If a student is away when order gets sent to their classroom, the class teacher will hold it for them for the next time they are in.
