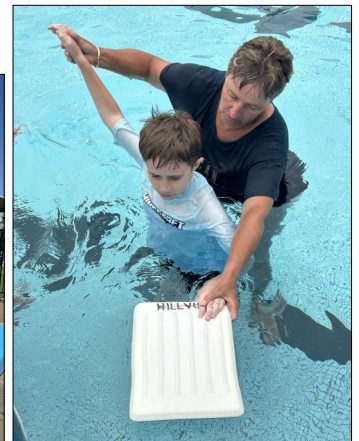
Year 2 Intensive Swimming Program

2022 has been another busy year with many changes. It is an exciting time, as we try to re-establish pre covid traditions whilst integrating new ideas and ways of communicating.

At Tamworth South we have a great leadership team which thrives on change, diversity and progress. The team is focussed on accelerating learning, using current theory and evidence to improve professional practice that provides students with the opportunity to be the best they can be. The opportunities being afforded to our learners is of the highest quality and meets the diverse learning needs of our students. Teachers continue to engage with professional learning because they know the importance of keeping abreast of current research to enable them to cater for the range of student needs, academic, social and emotional, within their classrooms.

I am proud and honoured to be able to work with some of the best educators that I have had the privilege to work alongside over the past 37 years. Their drive, passion, and determination; underpinned by skill, knowledge and empathy, has seen teaching and learning at Tamworth South continue to progress the achievement of our students. This is demonstrated by the 2021 and 2022 NAPLAN results that indicate an upswing in student performance. This data is used with other internal and external data to inform lessons. The entire teaching team are aware of areas needing development, through reflective practice and data analysis they are addressing the needs of individual students as well as student groups.

I must say thank you to the entire school team, our SAS staff, Student Learning Support Officers and of course the teaching staff, who have continued to lead and support the student's learning journey. You are all incredibly hardworking and clearly dedicated to the student at Tamworth South. I appreciate your expertise and encouragement of all the students and the improvements in results shown by our school data as you never forget our mantra "It's what's best for kids" and that behind the data there sits a child ready to learn. One of the obvious changes during 2022 has been to our admin area. Just as our classrooms have been refurbished with flexible furniture over the past few years, the refurbishment of the admin area has meant that Tamworth South now has a modern foyer with a more welcoming feel. Some of you may think this refurbishment was for the admin staff alone, but the staff at TSPS are just custodians for a short while as the school forever belongs to the community we are here to serve.

In 2022 we have increased our cultural responsive practices through engagement with Uraah Innovations,

Len Waters and the Language Nest, to deliver Gomeroi language and cultural lessons across the school. You have seen our didgeridoo group, supported by Mark Atkins, and our Aboriginal Dance groups that have been established to broaden our repertoire of meaningful culturally based initiatives. These initiatives are not just for our Aboriginal students, they are offered to all as we strive to break down barriers and engage students in their learning.

Each year I look back at what the students have achieved and how far they have all come. I want to congratulate all you wonderful young people in achieving a great milestone in your life. That of completing kindergarten to year 6 of primary school education. I'd like to specially congratulate year 6 as they move to high school – I bet your parents can't believe how quickly the time has flown since you were in kindy.

I have been incredibly impressed with our Year 6 students this year. Whilst, not all are recognised formally at this presentation, I know that they have all progressed so very much, both academically and socially. I am proud of each and everyone of you.

We had several families represented at our Presentation Day Ceremony who have been a part of the school for a very long time and marks the end of a long chapter in primary education. We have 26 families who are seeing their youngest child off to high school and will therefore end their association with Tamworth South. Thank you, to all of you for your contributions to the school. The school is certainly better for having had you as part of the school family.

On a final note, I would like to wish everyone an absolutely brilliant holiday break and I look forward to seeing you in 2023.

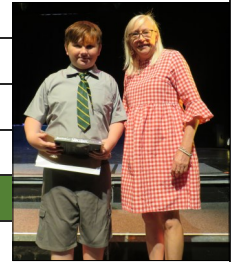

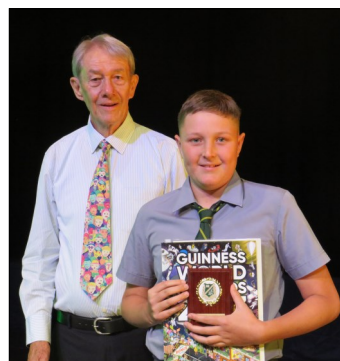

Students designed their own original dream car using any drawing materials, including, colour pencils, markers, crayons and water paints.

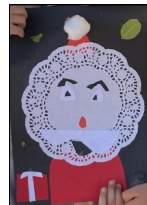
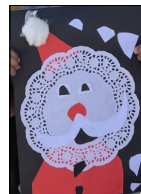
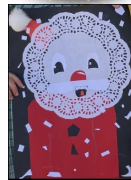

Orders after the 9:10am morning bell will only be able to be sandwiches.

We are now able to have volunteers back, however some days will still only have one staff member on site, so we appreciate your patience and understanding.

We encourage all to utilize the Flexi School App, it is very easy to use and convenient.

If you need to cancel a Flexi-School order, please do so before 9:00am, go into your order and press cancel, you will be refunded through Flexi themselves back into your account, we are not able to cancel the order ourselves as this is your individual account.

Please be aware that once an order is cooked, we are not able to refund if the child is not at school or leaves early, so we need to know as soon as possible, if your child has a sibling, we will offer it to them so it does not go to waste if they wish to have it.

We can hold some food over for the next day once the student is back at school and we will work with you as much as we can, however we cannot do this for anything hot as this would violate health and safety regulations.

We would like to thank you all for your patience and understanding over the last couple of years with all the COVID issues, we appreciate your continued support of our canteen.

Update on Uniform Shop Hours

If you wish to make an afternoon appointment send a post to the P & C Facebook page or contact the office and leave your details. We will contact you within 3 days to arrange an appointment.

Eftpos and cash will be accepted.

Parents/Carers can come to the canteen between the above times as we are unable to sell uniform shop stock in the mornings, due to no volunteers at this stage.

Parents/Carers can phone the school and be put through to order and the stock will be sent to the child in the lunch baskets.

Flexi Schools is still the most preferred option as it is easy for all. Any orders placed before 5:00pm should be sent to the student the next school day, however, sometimes there can be delays but all stock should be provided within 3 days of order.

If a student is away when order gets sent to their classroom, the class teacher will hold it for them for the next time they are in.
