SPELLING BEE

On Thursday 10 August Emily Hammond and Sage Chin competed in the Premier's Spelling Bee Regional Finals for Stage 2 and Stage 3 respectively.

Emily competed against 27 other students from Regional NSW in the Junior category. The competition was fierce, going beyond the six rounds of seen words. After three rounds of unseen words Emily was down to the final two. The competitor before Emily misspelled her word leaving it down to Emily to spell her word 'lavatory' correctly to win the competition. Emily remained composed and went on to spell the word correctly and graciously won the regional level of the spelling bee. Emily will now go on to compete at NSW State level of the competition in Term 4.

Sage also competed against 27 other students from Regional NSW in the Senior category of the Spelling Bee. The competition at senior level was also fiercely contested with a level of sophisticated words that would have had adults



stumped! Sage remained calm and focussed throughout the competition, making it down to the final four. With a competitor misspelling a word before her, Sage managed to take out third place at the Regional NSW level.

We are very proud of both girls for getting as far as they did at Regional level and we wish Emily good luck for the State competition.

Students from our school have recently undertaken, an education tour of the national capital. Students were given the opportunity to participate in a variety of educational programs with a focus on Australia's history, culture, heritage and democracy.

The Australian Government recognises the importance of all young Australians being able to visit the national capital as part of their Civics and Citizenship education. To assist families in meeting the cost of the excursion the Australian Government is contributing funding of \$67.50 per student under the Parliament and Civics Education Rebate (PACER) program towards those costs. The rebate is paid directly to the school upon completion of the excursion.

We would like to thank the Australian Government for their support of this program as students found this excursion a rewarding experience. Their visits included trips to Parliament House, the Australian War Memorial, old Parliament House and the National Planning Centre. Shopping at Questacon and testing their fitness levels at the Australian Institute of Sport were also memorable experiences for students.

Thank you to all for enabling our students to visit the national capital as part of their education.



Tamworth Zone Athletics carnival.

On Friday 11 August, 33 Tamworth South students competed against 22 other schools at the Tamworth Zone Athletics carnival.

Events contested were the 800m and 1500m, 100m and 200m, 4x100m Relay, Long Jump, High Jump, Shot Put and Discus.

All students are to be commended for their great behaviour, positive sportsmanship and for making a great effort to produce their best.

In the distance events Addison Lockyer (11 years) was 1st in the 800m and 2nd in the 1500m, while Naomi Sykes (Junior) was 4th in both the 800m and 1500m.


In the sprints Tilly Shipley, Amelia Cathro-Nean, Kylan Cathro-Nean, Brayth Townsend and Ethan Lanscar all qualified for the 100m final, with Addison Lockyer(11 years) and Ethan Lanscar (13 years) coming 1st, while Brayth Townsend was 2nd. In the 200m Addison Lockyer was again 1st and Brayth Townsend again 2nd.

The high jump saw Naomi Sykes (Junior) finish second, while Brayth Townsend (Junior) finished 3rd. Ashlyn Berryman (Junior) was 3rd in the shot put and Brayth Townsend was 1st in the Discus.

Special mention to Bailey Rickard for his efforts competing in six events in the Multi Class category including his final event the 800m.

In the relay both the boys and girls junior relay teams finished in 4th place.

Finally, the announcement of the zone champions saw Addison Lockyer awarded 11 years girls zone age champion and Brayth Townsend awarded Junior boys zone age champion.
