About No Parking Sign Infront of School on Petra Ave - response from Council

Please see below the minutes relating to the Petra Avenue No Parking Area.

20/2024 – Removal of No Stopping Area, Petra Avenue, South Tamworth (Council)

Council has been approached by the public requesting the removal of the **NO PARKING** area on Petra Avenue in South Tamworth. As shown below in *Figure 23*, the **NO PARKING** area applies to vehicles that park along the western side of Petra Avenue between the hours of 8:00am – 9:30am and 2:30pm – 4:00pm (School Days).

This sign allows people to stop within this area to unload/pick up passengers for less than 2 minutes (if they stay within 3m of the vehicle).

A disabled parking bay has been previously approved for installation by the Committee (*Item 48/2022*).

Does the Committee have any issues with removal of the **NO PARKNG** signs? Should Council change the **NO PARKING** signs to a short-term parking area?

NOTE: Council advised that they have no issues with the current configuration on Petra Avenue. In the current arrangement, vehicles are legally allowed to stop and off load / pick up children for 2min. This arrangement will enable high vehicle turnover to ensure there is always an available space.

NOTE: The current arrangement is similar a "Kiss and Drop" arrangement as utilised by other schools around NSW. Council suggested communications within the school newsletter to confirm this arrangement with parents. Signs could also be installed to advertise this arrangement.



Medical Conditions

Each year it is important that you notify the school if your child has a medical condition. This needs to be supported by your Doctor.

Your Doctor will provide you with a Medical Action Plan, this action plan is only active for 12 months.

It is a legal requirement that you provide the school with a current and updated plan each year.

This notification should occur either at the time of enrolment, or if your child is enrolled as soon after diagnosis as possible.

This ensures that the school community provides your child with the most effective support possible.

Please call the school if this applies to your child, so we can share information and clarify each other's expectations.

Mobile Phones and other Devices

If you have a child who brings a phone to school please remind them to hand it into the front office.

Phones are to be handed in upon arrival at school and to pick them up at the end of the day.

Students who fail to do so will have their phone confiscated and it will need to be collected from the office by a parent/carer.

Go into your Flexi App and click on Shop – pick your child's name – then click on the next available date – go to Fundraising items and click on which Mother's Day amount you would like.

Please note -

Each child will need to be selected separately; we cannot do Family orders.

You do not have to pick the Mother's Day Stall date; you can pick the next available ordering day and we will keep the order on file until the Mother's Day Stall, payment will be taken at time of ordering.

You can start ordering immediately as Flexi is available now.

No Fees will be incurred for these orders.

Flexi ordering will be available until Monday 6 May until 5:00pm. Flexi payments after 5:00pm on Monday 6 won't be accepted .

Once your child comes with their class, they will be handed their order invoice to use on the day.

We will post the class schedule on the Facebook page, please note that this could change at any time based on school activities.

For events such as these to continue, we are always on the lookout for volunteers. FOOT PAIN IN CHILDREN



Heel pain

If your child has been complaining of pain in their heel this is a common complaint, particularly between the ages of 8-15 years old. Commonly known as "growing pains", they should not be ignored and instead should be treated. Most often, this is caused by a growth plate becoming irritated and inflamed at the back of the heel. Typically, this pain will begin only after activity (such as a sporting event) and will increase to coming on during the activity also. A simple stretching program in combination with treatment can alleviate this pain.

Knee pain

In growing children, pain in the area just below the knee can occur; particularly with children who are involved in sports that involve lots of running and jumping. Swelling can often be visualised in the area where the pain is felt. It is important be in properly fitted and cushioned shoes to protect their growing knees and to seek advice should the pain persist.

Steps to take

If you child is noticeably limping or complaining about pain in the feet, legs or knees it is important to get this assessed. It is always a good idea to book in for an assessment of your child's feet to rule out any significant causing of pain. Often, a treatment plan can be commenced by a podiatrist to help your child be pain free.



The best things to look for in shoes

It is especially important to be wearing supportive shoes. This is especially important in sports such as soccer and netball in order to protect the knees and ankles.

A visit with a podiatrist can be helpful if you would like further advice on the best footwear choice for your child.

General advice:

- Firm shoe bottom
- Fully adjustable
- Thumb width at end of shoe
- Firm heel counter
- Limited ability to twist through middle portion
