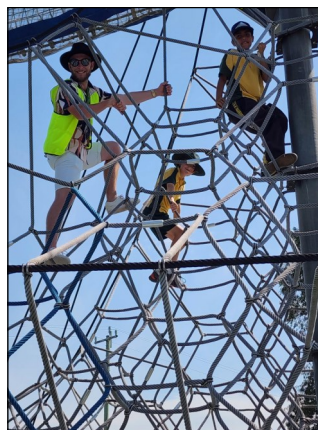
PBL Whole School Reward

If you have a child ready for kindergarten or you know someone who has a child ready to start school next year please contact the school and ask for an enrolment pack.

If you are out of zone you will need to complete an out of zone application. These applications are considered by a panel who will decide whether to accept or decline the enrolment based on the information provided.

When enrolling a student into a government school, you will need to have a number of documents.

Please provide a copy of a **standard birth certificate** (commemorative birth certificates cannot be used for enrolment), Australian Immunisation Register (AIR) statement/certificate and several documents proving residential address in the name of the enrolling parent or carer.

Boys' Rugby League and the Girls League Tag Team

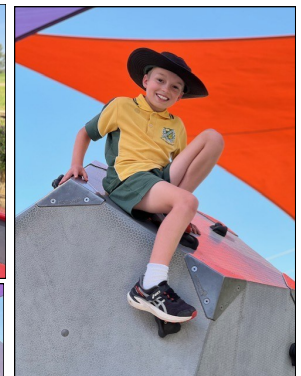
On Tuesday 24 September, the boys' rugby league team and girls league tag team went to the Minor League Fields to play a gala day against other schools around Tamworth.

The games ran for 15 minutes with no half time. The boys' rugby league team played six games and won all of them.


The girls league tag team played three games and won all of them. All the students involved enjoyed the day and showed good sportsmanship.

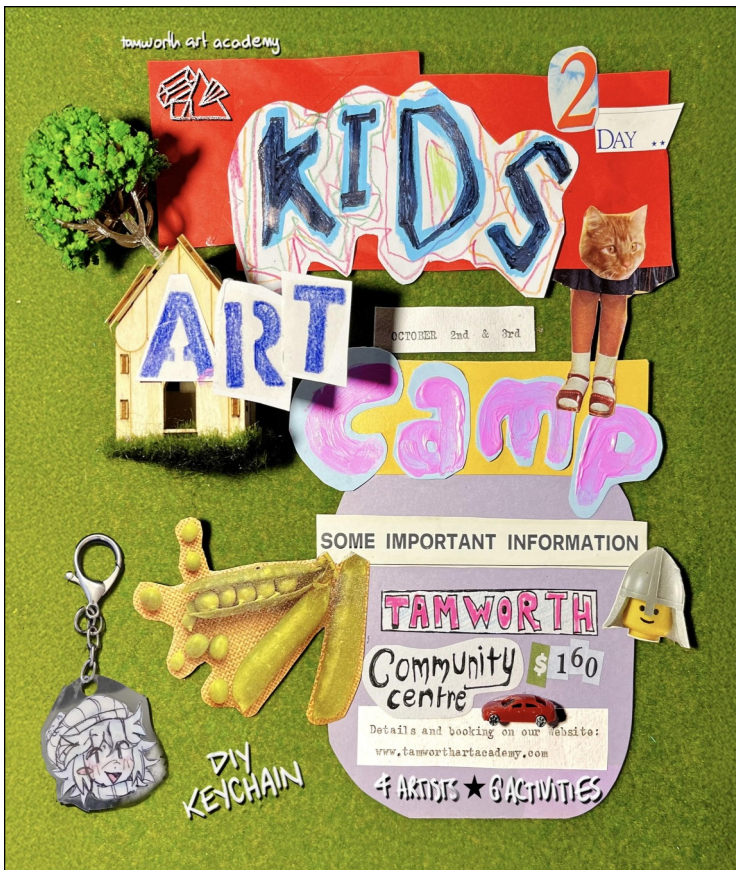

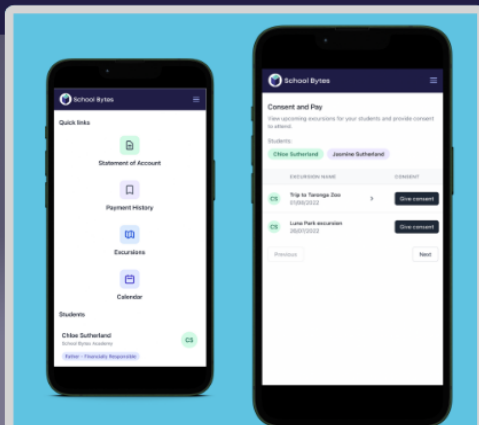



Keep an eye on screentime

Screens have increasingly become part of children's lives and can often be helpful and enjoyable for families. They can offer children opportunities to connect with friends and extended family, express creativity and learn.

Children and young people aged 5-17 years should limit sedentary recreational screentime to no more than 2 hours per day (excluding schoolwork).



While screen time has many benefits, long periods of time spent in front of screens can impact a child's growth and development including:

- Mental wellbeing
- Ability to form social connections
- Sleep
