


CAPERS 2025

Applications are closing on the Friday 21 February 2025 for Year 6 boys interested in attending Farrer Memorial Agricultural High School for Year 7 in 2026.

Day student applications are via Selective Schools for registration to sit the Selective Schools Placement Test.

Boarder student applications are submitted to Farrer and students do not need to sit the Selective Schools Placement Test.

To apply for either a Day or Boarding position visit the <u>Farrer website</u>.

Students interested in applying for both day and boarding will be required to complete both applications. Please note students local to Tamworth will not immediately be interviewed for boarding positions. They will only be considered if there are places available after the first round of offers are complete.
